

English Language Education Programme Plan(2023/2024)

1. Aims
 - To provide every student with further opportunities for extending their knowledge and experience in English Language as well as opportunities for personal and intellectual development, further studies, pleasure and work in the English medium; and
 - To enable every student to prepare for the changing socio-economic demands resulting from advances in information technology (IT) – demands which include the interpretation, use and production of texts for pleasure, study and work in the English medium.
2. Major Concerns
 1. Strengths
 - 1.1 Most students behave properly and are willing to take advice.
 - 1.2 Most English teachers majored in English and some are master degree holders.
 - 1.3 Most panel members are cooperative and helpful.
 - 1.4 The school management is always supportive and able to facilitate the English Department in implementing new initiatives.
 - 1.5 Students are now more familiar with the use of various online tools (i.e. Padlet) which promote collaborative learning.
 - 1.6 The updates of RaC Reading materials and LaC booklet enable students to learn more efficiently.
 - 1.7 The introduction of learning community is able to enhance students' motivation to learn.
 - 1.8 The cross-curricular collaboration allows students to learn from a different perspective.
 - 2 Weaknesses
 - 2.1 The quality of recent intake, in terms of motivation and English proficiency, has been deteriorating in recent years.
 - 2.2 The total teaching hours have been reduced due to the optimization of curriculum.
 - 2.3 Most students are passive learners and they are not confident in using English.
 - 2.4 Most students do not have reading habit.
 - 2.5 Most students show little interest in participating in English activities.
 - 2.6 The medium of instruction policy has limited the students' exposure to English.
 - 2.7 The range of students' ability is wide. Teachers find it highly challenging to cater for learner diversity.
 - 2.8 Teachers' stress is mounting due to the keen competition between schools.
3. Objectives
 - 3.1 To improve students' academic performance in both internal exam and external exam
 - 3.2 To build learning community in English classroom and beyond classroom
 - 3.3 To foster empathy in our students
 - 3.4 To nurture students to be a law-abiding citizens
 - 3.5 To ignite students' passion in learning English

- 3.6 To facilitate collaboration learning in classroom
- 3.7 To nurture students to be more industrious
- 3.8 To offer more opportunities for students to gain a sense of achievement
- 3.9 To expand students' vocabulary bank
- 3.10 To boost students' confidence in using English.
- 3.11 To promote reading to learn culture
- 3.12 To cultivate a good reading habit among students
- 3.13 To maximize students' exposure to a wide range of text-types and themes
- 3.14 To nurture students to become life-long learners in English learning
- 3.15 To enhance the learning and teaching effectiveness in English Language
- 3.16 To cater for diverse learning needs
- 3.17 To create a language-rich environment on campus in order to provide students with sufficient opportunities to use English outside the classroom
- 3.18 To encourage a culture of open discussion and professional exchange in the Department
- 3.19 To promote Language Across Curriculum (LAC) in school

4 . Evaluation and Follow-up:

QSIP:

It may be beneficial to provide ongoing support to teachers after the training program has ended, such as through mentoring or coaching. Additionally, it may be helpful to gather feedback from both teachers and students to determine the effectiveness of the program and make any necessary adjustments.

Collaborative learning:

It will be beneficial to provide training and support to both students and teachers on how to effectively use Padlet and other online platforms for collaborative learning. Also, it may be helpful to provide guidelines and expectations for student behaviours when using these platforms to ensure that they are used in a productive and respectful manner in classrooms.

English Activities (by part-time NETs)

It can be helpful to consider offering a wider range of courses in future years to cater to the diverse interests and needs of students.
